## What is PEARLS?

In an effort to shift the culture surrounding medical student professionalism from punitive to positive, the reward program **PEARLS** (*Professional*, *Empathetic*, *Accountable*, *Respectful*, *Leadership and Stewardship*) was created in October 2020. PEARLS regularly recognizes first-through fourth-year

medical students who exhibit exemplary professional behavior as physicians-in-training. The tiered reward program incentivizes students who exhibit the professional attributes of an exceptional physician through intentional action in the classroom, clinic or community that goes beyond the institutional expectations set forth for all students.
